At the September 25, 2025 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$800, of which \$400 is suspended, in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$400 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **November 10, 2025**.

FINAL ORDER

This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission (Commission) on September 25, 2025, by in-person, telephonic, and online streaming access. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and 42.17A RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

Commissioners present in-person were J. Robert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding); Douglass North, Commission Vice-Chair, and Commissioner James Oswald. Also present were Assistant Attorney General John S. Meader representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General Susie Giles-Klein, representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator. Notice was provided to the Respondent and he did not appear on his own behalf. The proceedings were open to the public and recorded.

8 **I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

9 This matter involves allegations the Respondent violated RCW 42.17A.205 and RCW
10 42.17A.700(2) by failing to file the required Candidate Registration (C-1 Report) and Personal
11 Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) covering the previous 12 months prior to becoming a
12 candidate for election year 2025, due within 14 days of becoming a candidate or no later than
13 May 23, 2025. The Respondent has one prior violation with the PDC.

- 15 1. The Respondent was a candidate for School Board Director for Sultan School
 - 16 District 311 and declared their candidacy on May 9, 2025, for the 2025 election
 - 17 year.
 - 18
 - 19 2. Between May 12 and May 27, 2025, PDC staff sent email reminders to all
 - 20 registered candidates regarding their missing C-1 and F-1 reports for election
 - 21 year 2025.
 - 22
 - 23 3. On September 3, 2025, PDC staff emailed and mailed the Respondent a hearing
 - 24 notice regarding the missing reports for election year 2025. The notice was sent
 - 25 to the Respondent's email and mailing addresses of record.
 - 26

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2 4. As of the date of the September 25, 2025 hearing before the Commission, the
3 Respondent had not filed the C-1 or F-1 reports covering election year 2025.
4

5 5. Respondent has one prior enforcement violation:
6

7 a. PDC Case 109536. Respondent was a 2022 candidate for State
8 Representative in Legislative District 12 and failed to file the required
9 C-1 and F-1 reports, that were due no later than June 4, 2022. At a July
10 21, 2022, Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief Enforcement Hearing),
11 Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.205 and RCW
12 42.17A,700 and assessed a \$400 civil penalty, with \$200 suspended,
13 provided the conditions of the order were met and there were no further
14 violations for four years. To date, Respondent has not paid the
15 outstanding \$400 civil penalty and has not filed the missing F-1 report.
16 The missing C-1 report for election year 2022 has been filed.
17

18 **II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

19 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter
20 42.17A. RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05
21 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
22

23 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A,205, a candidate for an election year must file a
24 Candidate Registration report (C-1 report) within two weeks of declaring their
25 candidacy for public office.
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3 3. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.700(2) a candidate for an election year must file a
4 Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) within two weeks of declaring their
5 candidacy for public office.
6

7 **III. ORDER**

8 This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and
9 aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Respondent is
10 assessed an aggregated civil penalty for failure to timely file both the C-1 and F-1 reports of
11 \$800, with \$400 suspended. The suspended portion of the civil penalty is subject to the
12 following conditions:
13

- 14 1. a. The non-suspended portion (\$400) of the \$800 civil penalty for
15 failure to timely file the C-1 and F-1 reports within two weeks of
16 becoming a candidate for the 2025 election year in violation of RCW
17 42.17A.205 and RCW 42.17A.700 are paid by the Respondent within 30
18 days of the date of this Final Order.
19
20 b. The Respondent files the missing C-1 and F-1 reports for
21 election year 2025, and the missing F-1 report for election year 2023,
22 and pays the delinquent civil penalty of \$250 (2023) including any
23 collection fees or costs within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
24
25 c. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC
26 reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further

1 violations of Chapter 42.17A RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years
2 of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be
3 assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or
4 error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a
5 technical correction.
6

- 7 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within
8 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar
9 year 2025 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection
10 or brought to Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by the
11 Commission.
