REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

I. Background

- a. Rachel Best-Campbell was a Woodinville City Council member from June 18, 2019, to December 21, 2025.
- b. Ms. Best-Campbell was elected to Woodinville City Council Position 3 in 2021 and ran for re-election in 2025.
- c. Ms. Best-Campbell received 26 percent of the vote in the 2025 Primary Election, was the top vote getter of five 2025 Primary Election candidates, and advanced to the 2025 General Election.
- d. Ms. Best-Campbell was not re-elected to the position in the 2025 General Election.
- e. Public Disclosure Commission (PDC) reports show \$56,269.06 in independent expenditures supporting Ms. Best-Campbell's campaign (the Campaign) and \$20,028.89 opposing the Campaign. **(EXHIBIT 1)**
- f. During the 2025 campaign for Woodinville City Council, Ms. Best-Campbell reported \$125,446.71 in contributions and \$125,446.71 in expenditures. **(EXHIBIT 2)**

- g. All contributions were reported as received from Ms. Best-Campbell and her spouse, Alex Campbell. **(EXHIBIT 2)**
- h. Of the 132 listed expenditures totaling \$125,446.71, three expenditures accounted for \$100,000 of the total. **(EXHIBIT 2)**
- i. The three expenditures were to sponsor three events:
 - i. June 16, 2025: Woodinville Summer Family Day
 - ii. August 22, 2025: Book Launch
 - iii. November 1, 2025: Peace, Love and Woodinville
- j. Ms. Best-Campbell admitted to PDC staff that the first two of the three expenditures (made in June and August) were not associated with the 2025 Woodinville City Council Campaign, however Ms. Best-Campbell admits the Peace, Love and Woodinville event was associated with the 2025 Woodinville City Council Campaign.
- k. On January 16, 2026, pursuant to Title 29B RCW and WACs 390-37-060 and 390-37-071, after having conducted a preliminary review and assessment of the complaint filed on November 2, 2025, PDC Staff opened a formal investigation and held an Initial Hearing (Case Status Review).

II. Allegations and Responses

a. Allegation 1: Failure to provide sponsor identification on campaign advertising.

- i. On November 2, 2025, PDC Staff received a complaint alleging that Ms. Best-Campbell's campaign failed to provide sponsor identification on campaign advertising, as required by RCW 42.17A.320. **(EXHIBIT 3)**
- ii. The complaint included an advertisement from Facebook for a November 1, 2025 event identified as "Peace, Love and Woodinville." The advertisement stated that the event was "[i]n collaboration with KEXP and Rachel Best-Campbell." **(EXHIBIT 3)**
- iii. The advertisement showed @RBCFORTHEPEOPLE as an event sponsor. Both Rachel Best-Campbell's Instagram and YouTube account usernames are @RBCFORTHEPEOPLE. **(EXHIBIT 3)**

b. Response to Allegation 1:

- i. A representative for Ms. Best-Campbell confirmed that the "Peace, Love and Woodinville" event was campaign-related.
- ii. Ms. Best-Campbell also stated: "The ad referenced in the complaint was not generated by, or coordinated with, our campaign." **(EXHIBIT 5)**

c. Allegation 2: Making expenditures not directly related to the 2025 campaign.

- i. The Campaign reported a \$25,000 expenditure made June 16, 2025, to Ruta Fulfillment LLC with the expenditure description of “Event sponsorship fee.” **(EXHIBIT 6)**
- ii. The Campaign reported an additional \$25,000 expenditure made August 22, 2025, to Ruta Fulfillment LLC, with the expenditure description of “Event sponsorship fee - Book Launch.” **(EXHIBIT 8)**

d. Response to Allegation 2:

- i. Regarding the “event sponsorship fee” from June 16, 2025: Ms. Best-Campbell’s campaign website, <https://bestcampbell.com/transparency-1>, under the heading “Non-Political Expenditures” identified the June 16, 2025 expenditure as sponsorship of the Woodinville Summer Family Day event. The website states “in the spirit of full disclosure, I chose to report this event to the Public Disclosure Commission *even though promotional book events do not require reporting as expenses*. No money was raised for me or my campaign.” (Emphasis in original). **(EXHIBIT 7)**
- ii. Regarding the “book launch” fee from August 22, 2025, Ms. Best-Campbell stated, “The book launch had nothing to do with the election.” **(EXHIBIT 5)**

e. Allegation 3: Failing to file accurate contribution and expenditure reports.

- i. On June 16, 2025, the campaign filed a contribution (C-3) report listing a \$25,000 contribution received June 16, 2025 from Rachel Best-Campbell. **(EXHIBIT 11)**
- ii. On July 15, 2025, the campaign filed an expenditure (C-4) report listing a \$25,000 expenditure made June 16, 2025 to Ruta Fulfillment LLC. **(EXHIBIT 6)**
- iii. On August 22, 2025, the campaign filed a C-3 report listing two contributions received from Rachel Best Campbell on Aug. 22, 2025 totaling \$27,000. **(EXHIBIT 10)**
- iv. On Sept. 1, 2025, the campaign filed a C-4 report listing a \$25,000 expenditure made Aug. 22 to Ruta Fulfillment LLC. **(EXHIBIT 8)**

- v. A representative for the campaign told PDC Staff these contributions and expenditures were not campaign related.

f. Response to Allegation 3:

- i. In response, Ms. Best-Campbell stated the campaign reported the events to the PDC in the interest of transparency. She told PDC Staff: “I chose to include those events and funding in my campaign reports because excluding them would have resulted in accusations of concealment. Of the two options available to my campaign, I chose the one with the higher transparency.”
- ii. A representative for Ms. Best-Campbell clarified that, while she deposited these funds into her campaign account (and spent them the day they were deposited for non-campaign purposes), Ms. Best-Campbell did so in the interest of public transparency to ensure she was not accused of having undisclosed campaign events. While the funds passed through her campaign account, the representative said, they were never intended to be campaign contributions or expenditures.

III. Investigative Findings

a. Allegation 1: Alleged violation of RCW 42.17A.320 for failing to provide sponsor identification on campaign advertising.

- i. Ms. Best-Campbell’s campaign sponsored the “Peace, Love, and Woodinville” event, telling PDC staff, “We sponsored food, drinks, and music for Peace, Love and Woodinville. No tickets were sold (tickets were free to all) and donations were neither solicited nor accepted.”
- ii. Ms. Best-Campbell claimed that the ad “was not generated by, or coordinated with, our campaign.”
- iii. The ad indicates that the sponsor of the event is Alchemy Events and Rentals. **(EXHIBIT 3)** Alchemy Events and Rentals is a registered trade name of Ruta Fulfillment, LLC. **(EXHIBIT 12)**
- iv. Ms. Best-Campbell’s campaign paid \$50,000 to Ruta Fulfillment, LLC to sponsor this event. Under RCW 42.17A.005(47)(a), “If a person acts as an agent for another or is reimbursed by another for the payment, the original source of the payment is the sponsor.” Since Ms. Best-Campbell is the original source of payment, she is considered the

sponsor and therefore responsible for ensuring advertising for her event included complete sponsor ID.

b. Allegation 2: Alleged violations of RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238 by making expenditures not directly related to the 2025 campaign.

- i. On June 16, 2025, Rachel Best-Campbell donated \$25,000 in personal funds to the campaign, with the campaign reporting the contribution on a C-3 report filed June 16, 2025. The campaign reported a \$25,000 expenditure to Ruta Fulfillment LLC the same day, June 16, 2025 on a C-4 report filed July 15, 2026. **(EXHIBIT 6)**
- ii. The June 16, 2025 expenditure for \$25,000 was for sponsorship of Woodinville Summer Family Day and was not related to the 2025 Campaign. The Campaign's website states: "The original sponsor for this event (Woodinville Summer Family Day) dropped out last-minute. The organizers contacted me, so I stepped in to help. I used the event to promote a children's book I have written." **(EXHIBIT 7)**
- iii. On Aug. 22, 2025, Rachel Best-Campbell donated \$25,000 in personal funds to the campaign, with the campaign reporting the contribution on a C-3 report filed Aug. 22, 2025. The campaign reported a \$25,000 expenditure to Ruta Fulfillment LLC the same day, Aug. 22, 2025, on a C-4 report filed Sept. 1, 2025. **(EXHIBIT 8)**
- iv. The August 22, 2025 expenditure for \$25,000 was not related to the 2025 Campaign. Ms. Best-Campbell stated to PDC staff: "The book launch had nothing to do with the election. Woodinville is a small town, and I am a recognizable face, thus we decided to report the event to PDC in the interest of transparency. No tickets were sold (tickets were free to all) and donations were neither solicited nor accepted." **(EXHIBIT 5)**

c. Allegation 3: Alleged violations of RCW 42.17A.240 for failing to accurately file contribution (C-3) and expenditure (C-4) reports.

- i. On C-3 reports, the campaign reported two separate \$25,000 contributions from Ms. Best-Campbell, contributed June 16, 2025 and Aug. 22, 2025, and on C-4 reports, the campaign reported corresponding expenditures of the same amounts made the same dates. **(EXHIBITS 8, 9, 10 and 11)**

- ii. Ms. Best-Campbell states these contributions/expenditures were not campaign related. Thus, the campaign filed inaccurate and/or misleading reports with the PDC concerning its campaign contributions/expenditures on June 16 and August 22, 2025.

d. Staff Determinations

Based on this investigation, PDC Staff determined as follows:

- i. Ms. Best-Campbell failed to include sponsor ID on the “Peace, Love, and Woodinville” Facebook advertisement included in the Complaint. Ms. Best-Campbell was the original source of payment for the event, with the entity advertising the event acting as the campaign’s agent. All event advertising required complete sponsor identification as required by RCW 42.17A.320.
- ii. Ms. Best-Campbell improperly used campaign funds for expenditures not directly related to her 2025 campaign. Of the Campaign’s \$125,446.71 total expenditures, the Campaign spent \$50,000 on sponsorships unrelated to the campaign, in violation of RCW 42.17A.445 and WAC 390-16-238. While Ms. Best-Campbell may claim not to have intended to use campaign money for these events, the established facts demonstrate that she contributed the money to her campaign account, which she then spent on non-campaign events. Since the money passed through her campaign bank account and was reported to the Commission as campaign contributions/expenditures, these transactions constitute the expenditure of campaign funds for non-campaign purposes.
- iii. In the alternative, if Ms. Best-Campbell did not use campaign funds to facilitate these non-campaign related expenditures, then the Campaign filed inaccurate reports when it disclosed these contributions/expenditures to the Commission. Since the purpose of C-3 and C-4 reports are to disclose campaign-related contributions and expenditures, the campaign filed misleading and/or inaccurate reports when it certified campaign-related contributions and expenditures made June 16 and Aug 22, 2025.

IV. Applicable Statutes and Rules

RCW 42.17A.005(47)(a) Defines “sponsor” as the person who pays for political advertising. If a person acts as an agent for another or is reimbursed by another for the payment, the original source of the payment is the sponsor.

RCW 42.17A.145 requires that every report and statement required to be filed under this chapter shall identify the person preparing it and shall be certified as complete and correct, both by the person preparing it and by the person on whose behalf it is filed.

RCW 42.17A.240 similarly requires that each report required under RCW [42.17A.235](#) (1) through (4) must be certified as correct by the treasurer and the candidate.

RCW 42.17A.240 requires committees file accurate campaign finance reports with the Public Disclosure Commission.

RCW 42.17A.320 sets forth the size and placement requirements for identifying the sponsor of political advertising.

RCW 42.17A.445 describes when the use of campaign funds for personal use is allowed by a candidate. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.445, contributions may only be paid to a candidate, a treasurer or other individual or expended for such individual's personal use under certain outlined conditions.

WAC 390-16-238 further outlines restrictions and requirements for the personal use of contributions. WAC 390-16-238(2) states an expenditure of a candidate's campaign funds will be considered personal use if it fulfills or pays for any commitment, obligation or expense that would exist irrespective of the candidate's election campaign.

V. Scope

a. PDC Staff reviewed the following:

- i. A complaint filed Nov. 2, 2025.
- ii. The initial response to the complaint submitted by Rachel Best-Campbell.

- iii. Email responses from Rachel Best-Campbell and her representatives to PDC Staff inquiries.
- iv. PDC reports submitted by Rachel Best-Campbell for Woodinville during the 2025 campaign year.
- v. The official 2025 Woodinville City Council Campaign website for Rachel Best-Campbell.
- vi. Social media sites linked from Rachel Best-Campbell's 2025 Woodinville City Council campaign website.
- vii. Business records from the Washington State Department of Revenue.

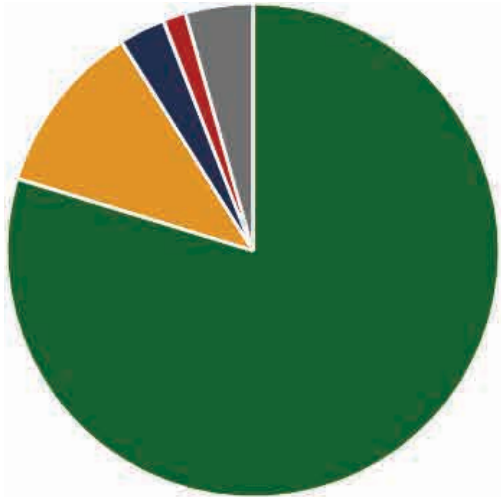

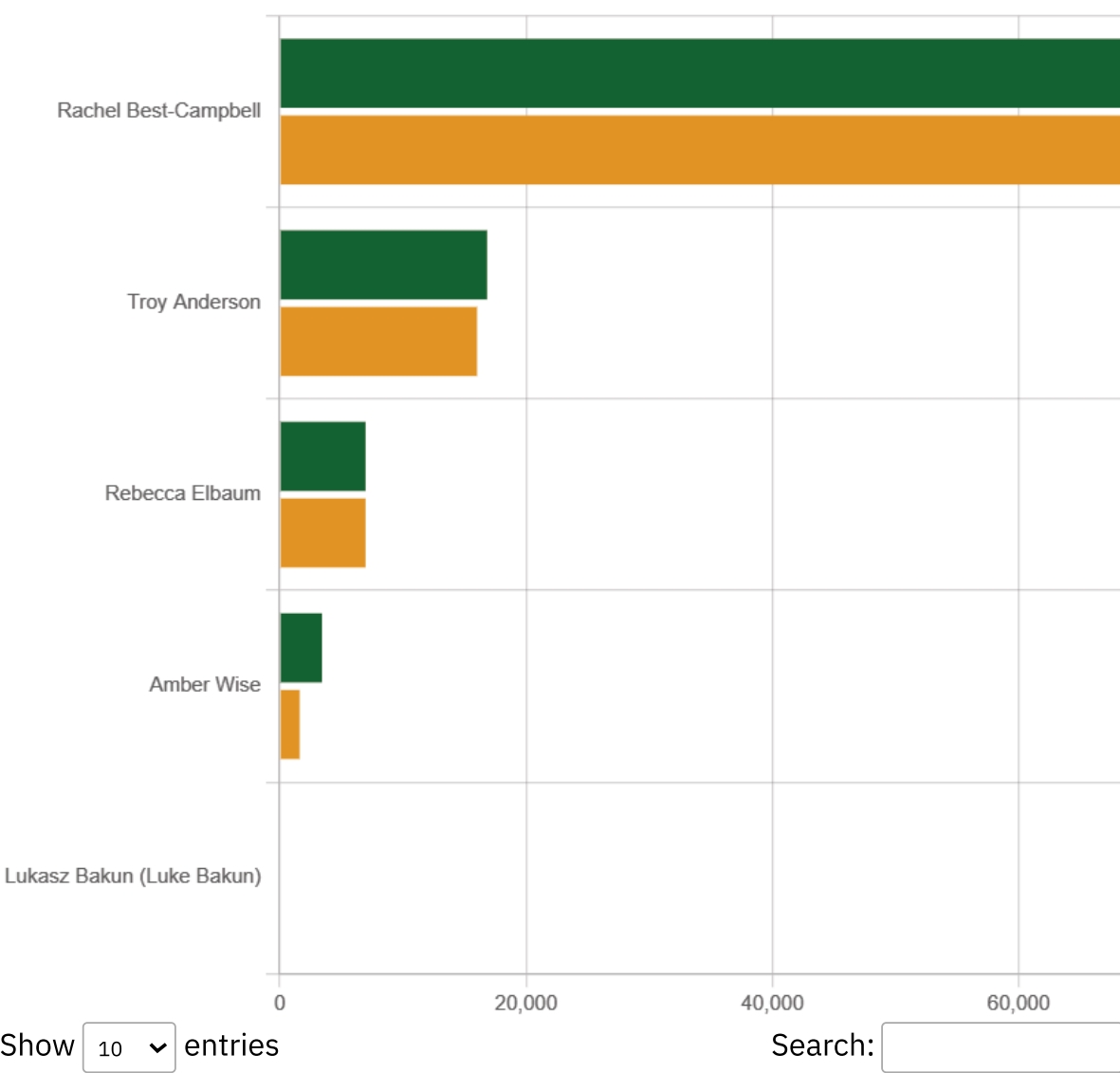

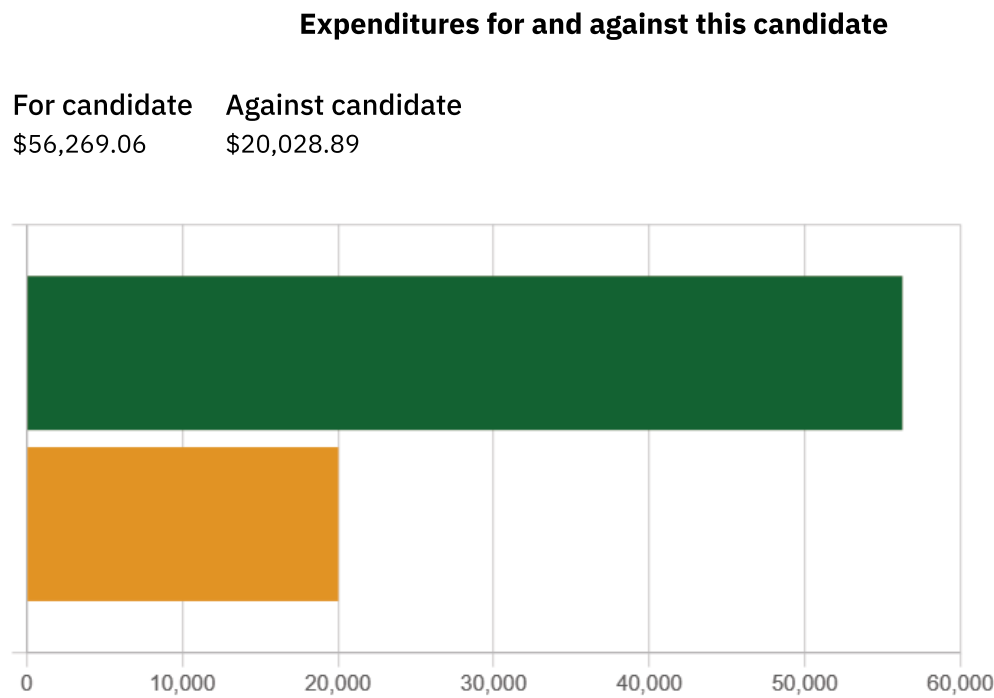

SAFE WALK TO SCHOOLS PART 1

DOWNTOWN CROSSINGS

		A key to Woodinville's downtown vision are walkable connections.
		In late 2020 I was approached by James and others about their many close-calls on 140th avenue and Garden Way.
	In 2016, I helped form and led a group "Wellington neighbors for safety". The goal was to improve safety for walking students. I held meetings with City staff and discussed pedestrian safety across the city. The data showed the most dangerous road for the largest number of students was 124th avenue from Woodmoor south to the Vinterra neighborhood .	A speed study found over 95% of cars were exceeding the speed limit behind Target. A first step was to upgrade those flags with flashing beacons.
My "radioactive spider bite" was about the dangerous routes kids walked to school in Woodinville. Even before joining council I advocated for safe walks.	I took that evidence back to the my neighborhood and together we pressed the city to prioritize that West Ridge project first - maximizing the benefit within the city's limited resources. We saw the value in prioritizing the most dangerous areas over focusing solely on our area.	While this has improved the situation, speeding continues to be an issue on 140th AVE.
Starting in 2016, I engaged City of Woodinville as a citizen through public comments and meetings with Staff. My focus was on safe walking paths near our schools. Originally, I focused on issues near Wellington Elementary, but it became clear from city statistics there were many more deficient areas.	By the fall of 2020, the new sidewalk was open and ready for use before schools re-opened.	My goal now is to upgrade the beacons into pedestrian-triggered full stoplights and add traffic calming features for everyone that needs to cross into downtown.
When I joined council in 2019, I pressed staff for the above survey map of all walk-paths in the city and have advocated for it ever since - prioritizing projects by the number of households benefiting.		

SAFE WALK TO SCHOOLS PART 2

STREET LIGHTS

GREENBRIER TRAIL

	Walking safely is not just for daylight hours.	Greenbrier park is a oasis of green preserved as part of this twenty year old development which included affordable cottages and senior apartments. Fully 26% of units are affordable. The park included a set of trails which had deteriorated without maintenance for years.
During the 2022 repaving west of Wellington Elementary, I worked closely with our Public Works department to include speed-bumps and a street parking redesign which separates walkers from traffic. Thoughtful design added zero new paved surface, saving on cost and keeping the project on schedule to be ready for the 2023 school year.	I have worked to advance streetlight projects to boost pedestrian safety as well.	In 2021, I proposed the city partner with Washington Trails Association to rejuvenate the trail system. The work was split across two winters, when WTA does low-land projects.
<i>While this was the road that started my safe walks advocacy, I will not slow down my work.</i>	In the 2022-2023 budget I pushed hard to include new streetlights along a one block stretch of 181st Place through the heart of our original downtown housing. The project did not make that budget, but I pushed again in 2024 and it was finally funded.	Leveraging volunteers from the community is an amazing way to build civic interest and create ownership in our parks systems.
A useful side-effect of the new design's parallel parking spots has been to create a practice area for young drivers on weekends.	Even where there are light poles, they need regular maintenance. The sweeping curve up from 522 east along 195th St was completely dark due to 9 separate streetlights being burned out. After months of pushing staff, even calling PSE myself, these were repaired in June 2024.	This little trail system is a prelude to the Wood Trails project (targeted for 2024) and shows Woodinville is a "Tree City" in every way.

WOOD TRAILS

DOWNTOWN SIDEWALKS

Wood Trails was first saved from a developer project in 2012 through the efforts of the group now named "Concerned Neighbors of Woodinville" (or CNW). Their efforts at the ballot box led to the property being purchased by the city. One of their members, Dave Henry, personally cut about a mile long hiking loop.	A walkable downtown needs proper maintenance. In 2023 I began to collect reports of cracked and buckled sidewalks. I brought these to attention of City Council and staff during our regular Councilmember Comments agenda item.
Since I joined Council in 2019, my vision was to take that land and create a hiking park . Then COVID got in the way.	Working with staff I accelerated the sidewalk repair schedule in our downtown with a focus on those sections used by our more senior residents. The project was boosted by a local property owner (TRF, owners of the complex housing Haggan, AMC, and Target) who updated their sidewalks around the same time.
I persisted and in 2022, I formally made the city owned property a park . Additionally, I pressed to fund initial trail construction in the 2022-2023 budget. While the funding was less than I hoped, it was a start.	These projects repaired tripping-hazards in our Central Business District making downtown walks safer for all ages.
In the autumn of 2024, the refreshed loop plus an additional north/south connector was opened to the public making this gem available for everyone in Woodinville and beyond.	<i>Going forward I will be pressing the City to prioritize it's backlog of ADA compliance changes across the downtown.</i>

HOLDING DEVELOPERS ACCOUNTABLE

WORKING FOR AFFORDABILITY

Development is inevitable; Poor development is preventable.	
We need housing, we need affordability, it require soulless blocky buildings.	Woodinville is a desirable place to live, making it a prime location for new development. At the same time our region has a well documented affordable housing shortage. The state and county have made it clear every city must help solve this crisis - now the key is for Woodinville to actually do it.
I have pressed for sensible standards that preserve sunlight on our streets and maintained views of our wooded hillsides. During the tourism district's "Harvest" negotiations I forced detailed view-corridor analysis and retail development to come first.	For years I have advanced the approach that if developers want special perks they must give something special in return. Including affordable units in their projects is the obvious solution.
Later votes, which I opposed, gave that all away. The lesson for everyone: The first deal with a developer will be the most the city ever gets, do not rush, do not amend, and do not believe the artist drawings.	
We have one chance to shape Woodinville's development and my job on City Council is to drive a hard bargain with developers.	• April 2023: I pressed the council to require at least a little affordability in Woodin Creek's future phases. • July 2023: I argued to increase the unit count required before a developer gets a full property-tax waiver. • November 2024: I called out a loophole in the fee-waiver program which will incentivize economic segregation. To date, the Council has refused to eliminate correct their error. • April 2025: I forced council to consider some level of required affordability in all future large developments. • May 2025: Council passed my proposal implementing the first ever required affordability in Woodinville.
A vibrant and walk-able downtown requires local businesses to be a destination for that walking. That is why I have worked to protect existing businesses from developer requested to rezones. As we look at the new development on the former Molbak's property and the new EMU zone we must continue to require 1st floor retail so that developers to create the type of community we want. Intergovernmental Projects

TRESTLE AND TRAFFIC

TRANSFER STATION - "NERTS"

More than a decade ago, the city identified the rail trestle in downtown as a major pinch point for our growing city's traffic. Previous councils worked hard on the legal procedures to purchase the old rail-line through downtown in order to address traffic and build a bike trail.	In 2020 King County announced their intention to replace the Houghton transfer station with a new facility called the North East Recycling and Transfer Station - or "NERTS" for short. To everyone's surprise, in 2021 Woodinville (which is the furthest from the service area and population centers) was included as a NERTS possible location.
By 2022 the land-ownership and legalities were arranged but the Federal Surface Transportation Board (STB) remained a blocker. Without the STB's permission, any new trestle would be required to be strong enough for a fully loaded train - a prohibitive expense.	City Council appointed me to be the city's NERTS representative in June 2021. King County Solid Waste had failed to disclose their dataset for site selection, at the first Site Advisory meeting and I forced a full pause on the process until every city received and rechecked the County's data.
I took the City's position to Washington DC in February 2023 and explained the situation to Senator Murray and Representative DelBene's staffs. They accelerated STB's review of our request and it was approved in April 2023.	While that was ongoing, I worked with city staff to hire a consultant for an independent economic impact analysis to strengthen our argument against Woodinville as a site.
Now we can execute on plans of councils past and build a new, wider bridge opening our downtown to residents and visitors alike.	The final step of site selection is the creation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). I worked with former mayors, key individuals and community groups to educate the public on how to best advocate for Woodinville during the EIS creation and review.
	The combined efforts of hundreds of people across four years helped the county Solid Waste Division officials make the right decision in March 2025: NERTS will remain at Houghton and Woodinville's roads, tourism, and environment will be protected.

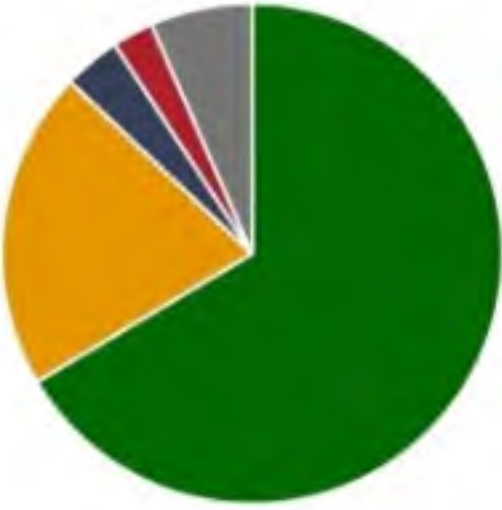


MY 2025 CAMPAIGN FINANCES

Itemized Campaign Spending

Now that the primary election is here, I wanted to take this moment to describe my campaign expenditures (as of July 15th 2025). This is the [same information](#) that I provided to the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission with additional context.

I self-funded my campaign with \$38,000.73 out of personal funds. That includes \$0.73 of interest from BECU in my campaign account. **I did not and will not take monetary donations from anyone.**

My in-kind donations are \$440.63. This includes rental of domain names and the bestcampbell.com website, which my family has owned for years.

- \$120.00 for the King County Elections Filing Fee
- \$7640.04 for postcards and postage
- \$756.74 for social media advertising
- \$992.89 for campaign signs plus metal stakes

- \$82.65 for postcards that were dropped on doorsteps
- \$34.44 for business cards
- \$396.70 for banner printing
- \$230.00 for renting banner space at a private business (includes \$5 cashier's check fee)
- \$261.78 for a voter mailing list
- \$20.00 for a few household decorative items to improve my signs

NON-POLITICAL EXPENDITURES

- \$1000.00 for Sisters in Action Sports for their Woodinville Skateboard Challenge.

This expenditure was made when the city council declined to fully fund the event. My donation [made the organization whole again](#).

- \$25,005.00 for sponsorship (includes \$5 cashier's check fee) of Woodinville Summer Family Day on June 28th 2025.

The original sponsor for this event dropped out last-minute. The organizers contacted me, so I stepped in to help. I used the event to promote a children's book I have written ([see this short video](#)).

In the spirit of full disclosure, I chose to report this event to the Public Disclosure Commission *even though promotional book events do not require reporting as expenses*. No money was raised for me or my campaign.

The organizers put on the event start to finish and my sponsorship helped them make it a success. All I asked for was a stage for my book readings. The organizers retain control of advertising and all contact information (emails, phone numbers, names, personal data). No information has or will be shared with anyone affiliated to my campaign.

OUTSIDE SPENDING I CAN NOT CONTROL

Independent expenditures are expenses paid by others that were not done in coordination with my campaign and were not requested nor authorized by me. This includes billboards and postcards with sponsor IDs not affiliated with my campaign.

Washington State law requires all electioneering materials to include a sponsor ID in clear print separate from the rest of the message. Anything with sponsorship description other than "Rachel Best-Campbell for Woodinville" is **not associated** to my campaign.
