Enclosed is a copy of the Public Disclosure Commission's Order Imposing Fine that was entered in the above-referenced case.

At the July 23, 2026 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$6000, of which \$3000 is suspended in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$3000 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **September 7, 2026**.

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15 This matter was heard by the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission
16 (Commission) on July 23, 2026, by in-person, telephonic, and online streaming access. The
17 hearing was held in accordance with Chapter 34.05 RCW, Title 29B RCW, and Chapter 390-37
18 WAC.

19 Commissioners present in-person were J. Robert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding);
20 Douglass North, Commission Vice-Chair, and Commissioner Matthew Segal. Commissioner
21 Teebah Alsaleh was present online. Also present were Assistant Attorneys General John S.
22 Meader and Amanda Migchelbrink representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney General
23 Susie Giles-Klein, representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance Coordinator.
24 Notice was provided to the Respondent, and he did not appear on his own behalf. The
25 proceedings were open to the public and recorded.
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1 The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

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- 3 • Memorandum, dated July 13, 2026, prepared by Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance
- 4 Coordinator;
- 5 • Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case Number 192727, dated July 1, 2026, for a July
- 6 23, 2026, enforcement hearing before the full Commission;
- 7 • Order Imposing Fine, PDC Case Number 156935, dated September 20, 2024.
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10 I. FINDINGS OF FACT

11 This matter involves allegations the Respondent violated RCW 29B.55.010 by failing to

12 file the required Personal Financial Affairs Statements (F-1 Report) for calendar year 2024, due

13 no later than April 15, 2025, and calendar year 2025, due no later than April 15, 2026. The

14 Respondent has one prior violation with the PDC.

- 15 1. The Respondent was a School Director for Enumclaw School District in
- 16 calendar years 2024 and 2025.
- 17
- 18 2. Between February 20, 2026, and April 20, 2026, PDC staff sent email reminders
- 19 to all officials regarding their missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2025.
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- 21 3. Between March 17 and May 5, 2025, PDC staff sent email reminders to all
- 22 officials regarding the missing F-1 reports for calendar year 2024.
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- 24 4. On July 1, 2026, PDC staff emailed the Respondent a hearing notice regarding
- 25 the missing reports for calendar years 2024 and 2025. Additionally, staff mailed
- 26

1 a copy of the hearing notice. The notice was sent to the Respondent's email and
2 address of record.

- 4 4. As of the date of the July 23, 2026, hearing before the Commission, the
5 Respondent had not filed the F-1 reports covering election years 2024 and 2025.
6

- 7 5. Respondent has one prior enforcement violation:
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9 a. PDC Case 156935. Respondent, School Director for Enumclaw
10 School District, failed to file his required Financial Affairs Statement (F-
11 1 report) for election year 2023, that was due no later than April 15,
12 2024. At an August 29, 2024, Adjudicative Proceeding (Brief
13 Enforcement Hearing), Respondent was found in violation of RCW
14 42.17A.700 and assessed a \$250 civil penalty, provided the conditions
15 of the order were met and there were no further violations for four years.
16 To date, Respondent has not paid the outstanding \$250 civil penalty and
17 the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2023 has not been filed.
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20 **II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 21 1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Title 29B
22 RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the
23 Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
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(2023), including any collection fees or costs, within 30 days of the date of this final order.

d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Title 29B RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.

2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar years 2024 and 2025 shall immediately become due and the matter may be sent to collection or brought to Superior Court as allowed by law without further action by the Commission.
