Enclosed is a copy of the Public Disclosure Commission's Order Imposing Fine that was entered in the above-referenced case.

At the July 23, 2026 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$6000, of which \$3000 is suspended in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$3000 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **September 7, 2026**.

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15 This matter was heard in-person and remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure
16 Commission (Commission) on July 23, 2026, by telephonic, and online streaming access.
17 Respondent Marlin Fryberg Jr. was provided notice on July 1, 2026, of the hearing date and did
18 not appear on his own behalf. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and
19 29B.55 RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

20 Commissioners present in-person were J. Robert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding);
21 Douglass North, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioners Matthew Segal. Commissioner
22 Teebah Alsaleh was present online. Also present in-person were Assistant Attorneys General
23 John S. Meader and Amanda Migchelbrink representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney
24 General Susie Giles-Klein, representing PDC Staff, and Jordan Campbell, PDC Compliance
25 Coordinator. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

1 The Commissioners had before them the following materials:

- 4 2. Enforcement Hearing Notice, PDC Case No. 192728, emailed, and dated July 1, 2026;
- 5 3. PDC Initial order, Case 141879, dated November 9, 2023;
- 6 4. PDC Initial order, Case 156882, dated September 20, 2024.

8 **I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

9 The matter involves Respondent Marlin Fryberg Jr., a Commissioner for Snohomish
10 County Fire Protection District 15 in 2024 and 2025. Respondent is alleged to have violated
11 RCW 29B.55.010 by failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report)
12 for calendar year 2024, due no later than April 15, 2025, and calendar year 2025 due no later
13 than April 14, 2026. The Respondent has two prior violations within the last five years.

15 1. Between February 20, and April 20, 2026, PDC staff sent email reminders to all
16 officials regarding the Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) due for calendar
17 year 2025.
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19 2. Between March 17 and May 5, 2025, PDC staff sent email reminders to all
20 officials regarding the Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) due for calendar
21 year 2024.

23 3. On July 1, 2026, PDC staff emailed the respondent a hearing notice regarding the
24 missing reports for 2024 and 2025. Additionally, staff mailed a copy of the
25 hearing notice. This hearing notice was sent to the Respondent's email and

1 address of record.

3 4. As of the date of the July 23, 2026, hearing the Respondent has not filed the
4 missing F-1 reports covering calendar years 2024 and 2025.

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6 5. There are two cases for prior violations of RCW 42.17A.700¹:

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- 9 • PDC Case 141879. At an October 11, 2023, Brief Enforcement
10 Hearing, Respondent was found in violation of RCW 42.17A.700
11 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2022, which was
12 due not later than April 17, 2023. A civil penalty of \$250 was
13 assessed in accordance with the penalty schedule adopted by the
14 Commission that was in effect at that time. The Respondent has
15 not filed the missing F-1 report or paid the civil penalty and it has
16 been sent to collections.
 - 17 • PDC Case 156882. At an August 29, 2024, Brief Enforcement
18 Hearing the Respondent was found in violation of RCW
19 42.17A.700 for failing to file the F-1 report for calendar year 2023,
20 and assessed a \$250 penalty. To date the Respondent has not filed
21 the missing F-1 report for calendar year 2023 or paid the
22 outstanding civil penalty and it has been sent to collections.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over this proceeding pursuant to Chapter 29B.55 RCW, the State campaign finance and disclosure law; Chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act; and Title 390 WAC.
2. Pursuant to RCW 29B.55.010, an elected or appointed official who held office in 2024 or 2025 was required to file an F-1 Report, disclosing financial information for calendar year 2024 and 2025 no later than April 15, 2025, and April 15, 2026, respectively.

III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$3,000 for each of the two late filed F-1 reports to total \$6000, with \$1,500 of each civil penalty (totaling \$3000) suspended on the following conditions:

1. a. The \$1,500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2024 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- b. The \$1,500 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2025 in violation of RCW

1 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final
2 Order.

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4 c. The past due civil penalties for failure to timely file the F-1 reports for
5 calendar year 2022 and 2023, in violation of RCW 42.17A.700, totaling \$500,
6 plus any collection fees, is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of
7 this Final Order.

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9 d. The missing F-1 reports for calendar years 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025,
10 are filed within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.

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12 e. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting
13 requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of
14 Chapter 29B.55 RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this
15 Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any
16 remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as
17 appropriate to address by a technical correction.

19 2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1)(a-d) of this order
20 within 30 days of the date of this order, or does not remain in full compliance
21 with Section III(1)(e), the suspended portion of the penalty for calendar years
22 2024 and 2025 shall immediately become due without further action by the
23 Commission and all past due penalties may be sent to collection or to Superior
24 Court for enforcement.
