Enclosed is a copy of the Public Disclosure Commission's Order Imposing Fine that was entered in the above-referenced case.

At the July 23, 2026 Enforcement hearing, the Commission assessed a total civil penalty of \$1200, of which \$600 is suspended in accordance with WAC 390-37-182. The \$600 non-suspended penalty is payable within 30 days of the date of this Order, which is **August 6, 2026**.

15 This matter was heard in-person and remotely by the Washington State Public Disclosure
16 Commission (Commission) on July 23, 2026, by telephonic, and online streaming access.
17 Respondent Anthony Berkley was provided notice on July 1, 2026, of the hearing date and did
18 not appear on his own behalf. The hearing was held in accordance with Chapters 34.05 and
19 29B.55 RCW, and Chapter 390-37 WAC.

20 Commissioners present in-person were J. Robert Leach, Commission Chair (presiding);
21 Douglass North, Commission Vice-Chair; and Commissioner Matthew Segal. Commissioner
22 Teebah Alsaleh was present online. Also present in-person were Assistant Attorneys General
23 John S. Meader and Amanda Migchelbrink representing the Commission, Assistant Attorney
24 General Susie Giles-Klein, representing PDC Staff, and Ashley Joslyn, PDC Compliance
25 Coordinator. The proceeding was open to the public and recorded.

6 7 **I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

8 The matter involves Respondent Anthony Berkley, a Hospital Commissioner for King
9 County Hospital District 1 Valley, during 2024 and 2025. Respondent is alleged to have violated
10 RCW 29B.55.010 by failing to timely file a Personal Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report)
11 for calendar years 2024 and 2025, due no later than April 15, 2025, and April 15, 2026,
12 respectively. The Respondent has one prior violation within the last five years.

14 1. Between February 20, and April 20, 2026, PDC staff sent email reminders to all
15 officials regarding the Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) due for calendar
16 year 2025.

18 2. Between March 17 and May 5, 2025, PDC staff sent email reminders to all
19 officials regarding the Financial Affairs Statement (F-1 Report) due for calendar
20 year 2024.
 - 21
22 3. On July 1, 2026, PDC staff sent the respondent a hearing notice regarding the
23 missing reports for 2024 and 2025. The notice was sent to the Respondent's email
24 and mailing address of record.

III. ORDER

This Order will be the Final Order. After consideration of the mitigating and aggravating factors, the Findings of Fact, and the Conclusions of Law, the Commission assesses a civil penalty of \$600 for each of the late filed F-1 reports, to total \$1,200, with \$300 suspended for each violation (totaling \$600) on the following conditions:

1. a. The \$300 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2025 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- b. The \$300 non-suspended portion of the civil penalty due for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2024 in violation of RCW 42.17A.700 is paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- c. The past due civil penalties for failure to timely file the F-1 report for calendar year 2023, in violation of RCW 42.17A.700, totaling \$250, plus any collection fees, are paid by the Respondent within 30 days of the date of this Final Order.
- d. The Respondent remains in full compliance with all PDC reporting requirements and is not found to have committed any further violations of Chapter 29B.55 RCW or Title 390 WAC within four years of the date of this Final Order. The suspended penalty shall not be assessed based solely upon any

remediable violation, minor violation, or error classified by the Commission as appropriate to address by a technical correction.

2. If the Respondent fails to meet the conditions in Section III(1)(a-c) of this order within 30 days of the date of this order, or does not remain in full compliance with Section III(1)(d), the suspended portion of the penalties for calendar year 2024 and 2025 shall immediately become due without further action by the Commission and all past due penalties may be sent to collection or to Superior Court for enforcement.
